Pioneer went out and developed new routes, opened up new country. Hotel standards in many areas did not please them, so they went into the hotel business, with a network extending through eastern Australia.

It was in 1947 that Ansett made an offer for the now famous Hayman Island, which was to reform the Barrier Reef as a tourist area.

Express bus routes became a distinct operation from touring. In 1955 daily express runs between Melbourne and Sydney began.

And so the Pioneering continued.

Eventually, along came a coach to replace the Flexi.

With the easing of monetary restrictions affecting overseas transactions by Australian companies, the Ansett organisation began to evaluate the latest trends in coach construction overseas, and the equipment available.

U.S. COACH

The outcome of the exhaustive evaluation was that an American-designed and built coach, the GM Super Clipper, was chosen as a replacement vehicle for the existing fleet of Flxible Clippers and assorted other vehicles.

Unable to be built satisfactorily in Australia, the first of the new GM Super Clippers arrived in Australia by sea, late in 1961.

The super-quiet, super-comfortable, fully air-conditioned coaches ushered in a new era of safe, smooth express travel between Australian capitals.

But the days of opening up new routes and new tours, and the days of change were far from over — they never will be.

Yet it is hard to believe that it was as late as the early 1960's that Ansett Pioneer undertook the first road tour to Western Australia. Named the "Westlander Tour", it was the forerunner of many more tours and, later, express services to Perth across the Nullarbor.

The planning and thought which went into the Westlander was the same as required in the beginning with Mr. Withers, and the principles remain unchanged to the present time.

Changes and innovations are encouraged by Ansett Pioneer—even the first drivers' manual had a section in it asking for employees to volunteer suggestions and ideas.

So in 1963 came another first for the company, it joined the famous Gray Line Sightseeing Association, the first tour operator outside North America invited to do so, and is still the sole Australian representative of Gray Line Sightseeing Companies Associated (Inc.).

This organisation, established in U.S.A., circles the world through the U.S., Canada, Mexico, Africa, the Atlantic Island resorts, the Caribbean, across the whole of Europe, Britain, the Middle and Far East, the Pacific, and Central and South America.

It is not only a guarantee of standards of service, but it also provides a forum for the exchange of ideas, so that Ansett Pioneer is internationally recognised as a coach operator, and at the same time kept abreast of world-wide trends.

FORESIGHT

Ansett Pioneer has a worldwide network of representatives. It has its own offices in New Zealand, and is directly represented in Canada, Japan South Britain. Africa and Singapore. In 1970, Ansett Pioneer entered into a crossagreement with the worldfamous American Greyhound company to act as agents on each other's behalf.

The leadership in the coach industry in Australia created by Ansett Pioneer has resulted in it being the sole representatives in Australia for the Gray Line sightseeing tours group.

Ansett Pioneer has also linked with Midland Tours in New Zealand and Pioneer-Midland operates a range of top class tours throughout New Zealand, especially designed for overseas visitiors.

Determined to offer even better facilities for its users, the company in 1972 imported the first of a fleet of 40 foot long MC7 Super Cruiser coaches, built by Motor Coach Industries of Winnipeg, Canada — a wholly owned division of the Greyhound Corporation of America, the world's largest coach operator.

Their coaches, therefore, have all the safety and comfort features upon which Greyhound insist.

The arrival of Ansett Pioneer's first Super Cruiser in 1972 was the result of five years of planning and preparation.

NETWORK

Introduction of the Super Cruiser involved Ansett Pioneer in close liaison with Australia's five State Governments, the Northern Territory Administration and the Australian Capital Territory. Approval of all State Governments was vital before the Super Cruiser could be introduced to Australian roads.

The MC7 operated initially along eastern coast roads linking Adelaide, Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane with Cairns in Northern Queensland, routes that were formerly the domain of the company's 35 foot coaches.

Now the company also operates a fleet of the later model MC8 coaches.

Could Mr. A. A. Withers, for all his foresight, have envisaged a Super Cruiser when he started out so long ago?

Could he foresee a time when half a million passengers would travel across the length and breadth of Australia on 143 coaches kept going by 700 employees?

Did he know that coaches would cost \$140,000 each, as the Super Cruisers do? Did R. M. Ansett know that fact when Ansair started out after the War building a bus for \$5,200?

Perhaps they did. For it is on the vision of men such as the Withers and the Ansetts of the world that companies such as Ansett Pioneer are born, and grow and survive. Their efforts provide the solid foundation on which even greater coach operations will be built.


